Splinter Reeds is dedicated to the creation and presentation of new works for reed quintet through collaborative work with composers and musicians across multiple fields, as well as compelling performances for adventurous and curious audiences.

Ensemble Bio

Splinter Reeds is the West Coast's first reed quintet, formed in 2013 with the coming together of five colleagues highly active in multiple facets of the New Music scene throughout the Bay Area and internationally. The sum of their wide ranges of experience – in settings including free jazz, improvisation, electronic music, pop, punk, and metal as well as classical – has enabled them to rapidly zero in on a distinct aesthetic identity. Distinguishing themselves amongst even the relatively small number of professional reed quintets currently active worldwide, the ensemble is explicitly dedicated to cutting-edge composition and expanding the existing reed quintet repertoire through the collaborative development of new works by emerging and established composers.

As a relatively new chamber music genre, the reed quintet is an evolutionary detour from the traditional woodwind quintet with the advantages of a more closely related instrument family. Splinter Reeds has explored the genre's expansive possibilities in close work with such composers as Amadeus Regucera, Eric Wubbels, Sky Macklay, Paula Matthusen, Marc Mellits, Michael Gordon, Theresa Wong and Ken Ueno, while presenting North American premieres by European-based composers Dai Fujikura, Matthew Shlomowitz, and Yannis Kyriakides, among others.

The group's commissions are featured alongside other key repertoire on two full albums, the second of which – dubbed "impressive" by Steve Smith in the New Yorker – was released by New Focus Recordings in 2019. Notable performances have included appearances at Time:Spans (NY), Music Current (Dublin, Ireland), Vancouver New Music, Frequency Series at Chicago's Constellation, Festival of New American Music (Sacramento), Blue Sage Center for the Arts (Paonia, CO), and Indexical (Santa Cruz), as well as numerous academic institutions across the country.

Educational Programs

Splinter Reeds offers a variety of classes and presentations in chamber music, instrumental performance, professional development, and contemporary music topics. These programs are tailored to students in pre-professional settings, as well as the general public, and can function as stand alone events or serve to enhance a Splinter Reeds performance or residency. Since 2020, they are equipped to present virtual residencies and streaming performances.



Composition Students:

- Readings, workshops, and recordings of student composers' works at the undergraduate and graduate level. A single session would entail a composition reading, discussion and feedback of the work, and a second reading/recording of the piece. A longer collaborative project would culminate in a concert of premieres featuring student works.
- Lecture/demonstration about writing for the reed quintet, including individual instrument techniques, extended techniques, and notation, as well as examples from the existing repertoire.

Performance Students:

- Woodwind chamber music coaching and rehearsal techniques at the undergraduate and graduate level. Chamber music coaching may be presented in a masterclass setting or as a private coaching.
- Individual instrument lessons and studio masterclasses in clarinet, bass clarinet, oboe, saxophone, and bassoon.
- Individual instrument lecture/demonstration highlighting extended techniques and contemporary solo repertoire.

All Students:

- Arts leadership and professional development topics relevant to all music students. Past sessions have included discussions surrounding life after college, logistics of starting and sustaining a chamber ensemble, and practical skills for a successful career in music.
- Contemporary improvisation workshop (interactive) that includes exercises for both advanced and beginning improvisers.

General Public:

• Pre-concert talks and audience Q&As with members of the ensemble that provide further insight to the performance as well as the history and process surrounding a compositions' development.


